

## Holguin analyzes vulnerable families and prices as part of Task Order

The entities and organizations of the territory with the greatest incidence in the Task, and those that generate the greatest amount of concern up to now, took part in the meeting, together with the 14 municipalities of Holguin through the videoconference system.

The meeting helped leaders get clear about vacancies, in order to improve employment opportunities for families identified as vulnerable.

It was said the the priority within the Task Order is to fill vacancies in the production of goods and services, which will then allow growth in the budgeted sector. The same should happen with the budgeted agencies of National Subordination.

"Since December 10, more than 3,500 people applied for jobs in our province, hence the need to complete the positions in the productive sector to boost the country's economy," said governor Julio Cesar Estupiñan Rodriguez.

Of the number of people who applied for work, about 1,500 are already located. But there is still the need to better exploit the potential of the province.

For example, today in the province there are more than 16 thousand idle hectares, as well as a considerable number in the agriculture and construction sectors, whose results directly affect the production of goods and services.

Regarding the main concerns of the population received through the different channels, Alberto Leyva, coordinator for the Government's Economic Programs, explained the treatment given to the workers who, for different reasons, had yet to receive their advance payment, as well as the availability of places in Holguín at present.

In the case of the concerns of the entities and agencies regarding the process of Ordering, an electronic address was created from which they will clarify their questions.

Regarding the economy of the province, Manuel Cuenca, provincial director of Economy and Planning in the territory, explained that sales are estimated at 23 billion pesos, when the average sales were around 7 billion.

In the case of the lunches in the workers' dining rooms, he clarified that there should not be expensive prices at this time, since they are still working with December costs, and that soon the new prices will begin to be applied, which are also currently being reviewed by the organizations authorized to reduce them.

In conclusion, the directors of Labor and the National Office of Taxation and Customs (ONAT) provided information from their agencies, to then give way to the report on the behavior of crime in the province.

One of the novelties of the meeting was the announcement of the Business Forum to be held on the 29th and 30th of this month, whose objective will be to strengthen the productive chains and the search for strategic alliances.

For his part, Alexander Rojas Rojas, head of the Institutional Communication Department of the Government, referred to the lines of message for internal and external audiences of the entities and agencies, among these are the following Task Ordering and confronting abusive prices. The Improvement of the Trade System. Activities for the Triumph of the Revolution. Confronting the Covid-19. And the Development Strategies until 2030, Post Covid-19 and Food and Nutritional Sovereignty.

"The province cannot be oblivious to the needs and concerns of the population, because many families depend on it. And we must provide a lot of information to the people, publish and inform," added Yunia Perez Hernandez, Deputy Governor.
